














PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Options for Recovery (OFR) is a program within the County of San Diego Foster & Adoptive Resource Family Services. The Options program provides specialized training, and support for resource families, relative caretakers and non-related extended family members (NREFM) who care for dependent children ages 0 to 60 months who are drug and/or alcohol exposed and/or HIV positive.

GOALS

- To intervene early to minimize the devastating effects of maternal substance abuse on infants and toddlers
- To maximize the health and attachment of infants and children of substance abusing women
- To limit the number of children in high cost institutionalized placements, such as hospitals & group homes
- Whenever possible, to support the reunification of the substance exposed and/or HIV positive children with a biological parent

REQUIREMENTS

- Must be pending or approved Resource Family
- Complete intake: pre-approval by Options coordinator, application, and home visit
- A non-smoking home
- Not a licensed daycare
- Able to meet the needs of extra appointments
- Attend and complete the Options training Through Rady Children's Hospital (33 hours)
- No more than 2 Options qualified children at a time (exceptions made case by case)





BENEFITS

- Specialized training through the Chadwick Center/Rady Children's Hospital
- Monthly Options support group held on the first Wednesday of the Month (Except July, August, and September)
- Upon completion of training and with a qualifying child, Options families may receive up to 48 hours of paid respite per month
- Annual Options recognition event
